All interviews will be scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis, however seniors will be given preference during the first two weeks. Please state class standing when requesting interviews. Luncheon speaker: Patrick McDowell will be the luncheon speaker. McDowell spent a quarter-century as an international correspondent before becoming the AP's assistant chief of bureau for Indiana and Illinois last May. McDowell spent six years as AP's editor for the Asia-Pacific region in Bangkok, leading coverage of the 2004 tsunami that won AP the National Headliner Award for Deadline Reporting. McDowell also oversaw the strategic expansion of AP's coverage of China in the lead-up to the 2008 Olympics and the Kabul bureau buildup for the surge of American troops in Afghanistan. He helped cover the 2003 invasion of Iraq and the collapse of the Khmer Rouge revolutionary movement in Cambodia and has worked in Paris and Johannesburg, where he covered Nelson's Mandela's post-apartheid presidency. McDowell has a master's degree in international journalism from City University in London and a recent MBA from the University of Chicago.
